Argyll & Bute Council has worked with Hey Girls for a number of years, making products available in more than 100 locations across the council area.

'The Period Products Act' was a historic moment for Scotland and has opened the doors to partnerships with local authorities across the country, but Argyll & Bute are one of those who took the leap to partner with Hey Girls before the law was passed.

The council had planned an initiative to provide period products to residents and found Hey Girls ticked all the boxes in terms of their environmental and social ethos.

The council received more than 150 orders in less than a month, with anyone with a postal address in the council area able to make an order through Hey Girls – making for a more time efficient way to distribute orders directly to those in need.

A wide range of products have been purchased by the council, including disposable pads and tampons, as well as reusable pads and cups.
